To Be Aware Of...

- A person screaming for help, or being forced into a vehicle against their will.
- ♦ Someone peering into windows or parked cars.
- Property being removed from closed businesses or house when no one is home.
- Vehicles cruising with out a purpose.
- Graffiti on both public and private property.
- Strangers sitting in a car, stopping talking to kids.
- Abandoned vehicles, suspicious people, and unusual noises.
- A sudden change in a neighbors' routine: Newspaper piling up, Drapes drawn, mailbox overflowing with mail

Enhancing your Community through active participation!

- Organize meetings to discuss current issues such as:
 Drug Abuse, Gang Activity, Hate Crimes, etc.
- Encourage the use of safety equipment: deadbolt locks, and smoke alarms to protect our homes and businesses.
- Form a disaster preparedness program for your neighborhood.
