- Each church will adopt our local youth sports teams to provide support and mentoring to our children to serve as positive role models and encourage sportsmanship and teamwork.
- A team consisting of former gang members, local youths, who have not been involved in gangs, and Sheriff Deputies will be visiting local schools to provide information. They will encourage students to stay out of gangs to re-establish a positive relationship between the community and Sherif's Department.

F.A.I.T.H. is an action and faith based organization that will strive for success by empowering the members of our community through resources such as counseling, mentoring and teamwork. ANIMAL CONTROL NEWS

As of January 1, 2007, a law was passed in the state of California that prohibits the tethering of a dog to any object for more than three hours in a 24-hour period. The term refers to the practice of fastening a dog to a stationary object or stake, usually in backyard, as a means of keeping the animal under control. Depending on the specific offense, violation of this new law could result in an infraction or misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$1, 000 per dog and/or up to six months in county jail. However, there are some exceptions to the law, which allow for dogs to be tied to a pulley system; tethered on farms; or short term tethering for the completion of temporary tasks.

DOG LICENSE INFO:

All dogs over four (4) months in the City of Hawaiian Gardens must be have rabies vaccination and a dog license. You may pay your dog license at Hawaiian Gardens City Hall, Monday-Friday, 8:00am - 4:30pm. Please bring complete information on your dog, including sterilization and vaccination records to: 21815 Pioneer Blvd to pay the necessary fees as follows:

\$30.00 New License: Renewal: \$30.00 Spayed/ Neutered: \$15.00

Spayed/Neutered w/ Senior discount: \$ 7.50

Senior discount applies to those 60 and older. Payment may be made by check, money order (payable to: County of Los Angeles - Animal

Care & Control), or in cash. License will be sent by mail in approximately 4 to 6 weeks.

CITY SPOT LIGHT: PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The City's Public Works Department has been a valuable resource for the City's public roadways. Even though the City contracts with various agencies for its' services, the Public Works Department continuously provides unconditional services throughout the public Edison Company; streets of the City. The department addresses the areas of parkway-median landscaping, fertilizing and city landscaping, irrigation repair and maintenance, weed control, installs poles and street signs, sign maintenance, board-ups and vandalism repairs, emergency work (accidents/spills/storms, flooding), alley clean ups, roadway debris removal, graffiti abatements, temporary repairs of potholes and curbs, gutters, and other miscellaneous street work.

The Public Works Department will report streetlights to the sewer & storm



drains to the County; gas leaks to the Gas Company; water leaks to the Water Company; phone lines to the phone company; roadway damage, problems with traffic signal lights, and toxic hazardous spills to the County. Residents may contact

ROBBERY CRIME TIPS HOW CAN I PROTECT MYSELF?

- Be aware of your surroundings and stay in well-lighted areas at night.
- There is safety in numbers: use the buddy system.
- If you carry a purse, don't put the strap over your shoulder. Carry it close to your body.
- Don't leave purses or wallets on a counter or in shopping carts.
- Be cautious of people just "hanging around," especially near banks, pay phones, building entrances, bus stops, and public restrooms. • Be aware of people around you when using your ATM card.
- If you are walking and a vehicle is following you, cross
- the street or turn around and go back. Lock your vehicle when unattended to prevent a
- criminal from hiding in your backseat.
- If you happen to be a victim of a robbery, Do Not Resist and Be Alert so that you can give deputies good information on the suspect.
