As a reminder, please do not burn or

dispose Christmas trees on streets, alleyways, or vacant lots. Under the HGMC 6.12.010 the dumping of Christmas trees is considered Illegal Dumping. Also under HGMC 18.50.090 B (11) Outdoor ornaments, decorations and Christmas lighting being displayed between the months of February through October are considered a nuisance. The violation of these codes may and can result in the issuance of a fine. The City Council and Staff wishes you and your family a Happy Holidays.

AVOIDING THEFT

Theft is a serious event which occurs without notice or warning. However the following preventative measures can help you avoid becoming a victim of theft:

- Do not leave any important items in your vehicle. Items such as: Gym bags, garage door openers, mail, CD's and CD cases, purses, wallets (including those under the seat), stereos, cell phones, computers, and jewelry are most commonly stolen.
- · If necessary to leave any of these items in your car properly hide them prior to reaching your destination to avoid a criminal from watching where items are hidden.
- Always lock your vehicle and if possible use a car alarm.
- Keep the copy of your registration in your car with the address portion blacked out to avoid a criminal from finding your home address.
- Do not leave mail or your garage door opener in

your car, especially where visible, since these items provide access to personal information and to your home.

- Be aware of your surroundings. If someone near your car looks suspicious wait in a very public area and, if necessary, notify proper authorities.
- Always park in a well lit and visible area.

Besides protecting yourself and your vehicle there are ways to also protect your home from burglary with just a few minor additions. These additions include:

- Installation of lighting controls and motion sensors on the exterior of your garage.
- · Install deadbolts on all exterior doors and an adequate lock for your garage door.
- Install proper window safety locks.

So with a few adjustments to your daily routine and changes to your home you can help protect your family and belongings from theft this holiday season.

CHRISTMAS TIPS

Each year tragic fires start when Christmas decorations are misused or become deteriorated. The Fire Department encourages everyone to use good judgment and exercise caution this holiday sea-

son, and offers the following safety tips: avoid using extremely flammable decorations, don't place your Christmas tree in front of exits, and never use candles on/near your tree. Keep trees away from heaters, warm vents and open flame, purchase electric lights which have a testing laboratory label. Discard/replace malfunctioning lights, unplug electric decorations when not present, and use ground fault protection on outside displays. Use candles carefully and sturdy base candleholders, do not leave candles unattended; keep away from children and things that burn. Do not hang

Christmas stockings from the mantel when using your fireplace. Do not overload wall outlets during the holiday season, due to it being an unsafe practice and should be avoided even for short durations. To avoid possible overheating, do not coil or bunch an extension cord when in use and do not run it under carpets or rugs.
