Summary of the actions taken at the City Council meeting

CITY ATTORNEY

Ordinance No. 2023-609

Adopted ordinance to amend certain sections relating to the exemptions of chair massage establishments in the City and to require Certified Massage Practitioner's operating as independent contractors to obtain a City Business License pursuant to Title 5 of the City's Municipal Code.

CITY CLERK

Resolution No. 013-2023

Adopted resolution to approve the destruction of certain records in the department of Community
Development that are no longer required to be retained per our Records Retention Schedule.

Resolution No. 014-2023

Adopted resolution approving three (3) applications for the conduct and sale of Safe and Sane Fireworks from fireworks stands within the City, for the 2023 Independence Day celebration.

Policy

City Council incorporated Salute Armed Forces Everyday (SAFE) at City Council meetings to recognize all service persons.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Contracts

Approved a Second Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement to increase the contract by \$30,000 for completion of the third draft of the 6th Cycle Housing Element.

Approved a new Professional Services Agreement with Mobius Planning for an amount not to exceed \$132,000 to replace Willdan to complete the 6th Cycle Housing Element.

Resolution No. 015-2023

Adopted resolution to amend the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 citywide budget and add \$80,000 to the Community Development Department's contract services budget for work related to the 6th Cycle Housing Element Update.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Resolution No. 009-2023

Adopted resolution offering a reward of \$10,000 for information leading to the identification, apprehension, and conviction of person(s) whose willful misconduct resulted in the death of Carlos Alvarez Diaz.

PUBLIC WORKS

Resolution No. 012-2023

Adopted resolution approving the preliminary Engineer's Report for Consolidated Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District No. HG-LLA1 and declaring the City Council's intent to levy an assessment for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, and setting a public hearing on the proposed levy at the regular City Council meeting on Tuesday, June 13, 2023.

RECREATION

Resolution No. 008-2023

Adopted resolution to approve an agreement with Revolution Foods, Inc. to prepare and deliver meals for the Summer Food Services Program. This program provides free meals, Monday through Friday, for youth in our community. Proposed serving dates for 2023 are: June 12, 2023 – August 4, 2023. Lunches will be served at Clarkdale Park, Lee Ware Game Room, Teen Center and Faith Christian Fellowship Church, between the hours of 12:00 PM and 1:30 PM.

Resolution No. 010-2023

Adopted resolution to approving a project to repair the Lee Ware Pool Deck before the swimming season and the Canopy near the pool seating area.
